Thu, Mar 16 | 6:00 am - 9:00 pm | Harrisburg, PA

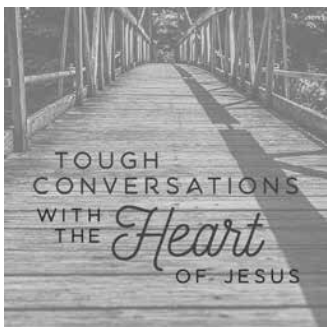
