Harriet Baka lives in South Sudan and is a coordinator for the Mothers' Union, working for peace and sustainable development in her country. She has been an inspiration not only in her own country, but also across the Anglican Communion. In the face of the displacement of 1.5 million people along with nearly half a million refugees fleeing the country, Harriet helped identify areas most in need of assistance. By training local distribution teams, Harriet has ensured that essential food rations reach the most vulnerable, even in remote areas.



## Portraits of Reconciliation: Canon Sarah Hills

Sarah Hills is Coventry Cathedral's Canon for Reconciliation Ministry. She was born in South Africa, brought up in Northern Ireland, and has lived in Sheffield in the UK since the mid-1980s. She was ordained in 2007, and has most recently held the post of the Bishop of Sheffield's Adviser in Pastoral Care and Reconciliation. Sarah has said, "Coventry Cathedral has long had a calling to work for reconciliation and peace. In 1940, the city was bombed during the blitz, and the medieval cathedral was ruined. Since then, Coventry Cathedral has pursued a message of reconciliation through our work locally, nationally, and globally."
