Welcome to Easter at Truro!

We welcome all visitors and guests at our various Sunday services. Truro is an orthodox Christian congregation, which means we believe that Jesus really and truly arose on the third day after his crucifixion. We believe it is the resurrection that declares his cross was, in fact, the moment when Jesus went toe-to-toe with evil and defeated it—defeated it the only way evil can be defeated, through self-sacrificial love.

The resurrection, in short, is presented by the gospel writers not as a “happy ending” after an increasingly sad and gloomy tale, but as the event which demonstrated that Jesus’s crucifixion dealt the death-blow to the dark forces that had stood in the way of God’s new world, God’s “kingdom” of powerful creative and restorative love, arriving “on earth as in heaven.”

Each of the gospel writers tell the same story of “victory over evil through the resurrection,”

but from different perspectives. As Tom Wright explains:

The resurrection is, from Mark's point of view, the moment when God's kingdom "comes with power." From John's point of view, it is the launching of the new creation, the new Genesis. From Matthew's point of view, it brings Jesus into the position for which he was always destined, that of the world's rightful lord, sending out his followers (as a new Roman emperor might send out his emissaries, but with methods that match the message) to call the world to follow him and learn his way of being human. From Luke's point of view, the resurrection is the moment when Israel's Messiah "enters into his glory" so that "repentance and forgiveness of sins" can now be announced to all the world as the way of life.

The Church is the people and place where this victory first gets implemented and proclaimed—the place where "the kingdom comes with power; the new creation is launched; where Jesus is proclaimed as LORD and where he 'enters his glory.'"

Truro is not a perfect church (of course, there is no perfect church), but if you are looking for a community that is learning to love like God, where evil is not overcome with evil but with good, then Truro may be the place God is calling you to follow him.
