Sarah has said, "Coventry Cathedral has long had a calling to work for reconciliation and peace. In 1940, the city was bombed during the blitz, and the medieval cathedral was ruined. Since then, Coventry Cathedral has pursued a message of reconciliation through our work locally, nationally, and globally."
