Report on "Fresh Expressions" by Clint Petty

I attended the Friday session of the gathering, as my first direct taste of the Fresh Expressions movement. In short, I was deeply impressed, encouraged, and refreshed.

The shared commitment of the assembled group (about 400!) was palpable, and was well described by the National Director, Chris Backert, when he said that they were about "putting the church that Jesus loves closer to where the people Jesus loves actually are". The conference organizers had selected the word "AND" as a watchword, to indicate that the question isn't shall we "do this", OR "do that" but that we can we "do this" AND "do that" (and that, and that...). No one has an inside track on the gospel or the Spirit of God. We are all entrusted with some portion of the task, and it is our individual responsibilities to work out how we will carry out that mission within whatever our understanding of "church" is, and learn from and support one another as we do it. **i** Continue reading here: bit.ly/1rjB8K.
