Today Is Pentecost—What Does That Mean?

Following Jesus' death, resurrection, and ascension, Jesus gave his disciples specific instructions: to wait until he sent his Helper to them. So they waited, praying and breaking bread together. "When the day of Pentecost arrived, they were all together in one place. And suddenly there came from heaven a sound like a mighty rushing wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting" (Acts 2:1-2). The Holy Spirit came like tongues of fire, and the Holy Spirit enabled Jesus' followers to speak in other languages. When others in Jerusalem began to gather, people from all over the world heard Jesus' followers speaking of Him in their own languages, and many from all over the world (more than 3,000!) believed and were baptized.
