Ever since I felt called to leave video production and work in the church, I have wanted to develop mission shaped church, church that is able to engage the culture where it is.

We know at least two things about the task of creating mission shaped church: 1. the need is urgent as an entire generation (and culture) drifts away from the church, and 2. there is probably not just one "shape" of church that can reverse that tide in every context or for all people. Which means some of us will be called to experiment and try to develop local "fresh expressions" of church. Indeed, Kim and I originally came to Washington DC with the aim of planting, something we talked about with Tory right from the start. And there comes a moment when we have to say to ourselves, "if not now, then when?"

Unless God directs otherwise, we are praying about somewhere closer to where we live, between West Falls Church and the Merrifield/Mosaic district, an area undergoing significant change and population migration, often markers of opportunity for the church (and it's not too far from Truro).

But this is not goodbye! We are not leaving, but changing our role. I will continue to serve as an adjunct Priest at Truro and hope to work with Tory and Canon Andrew White on the proposed School of Reconciliation (together with St Paul's Theological Centre), whilst developing a Fresh Expression of church.

This is an uncertain and challenging time for us as a family. And we want to stay as connected and engaged with our Truro family as possible. We have learned so much during our time here (and still have a lot to learn from you). It has been a time of real growth for us, and we're tremendously grateful for that. You have cared for and loved us as a family unbelievably well, and we remain committed to Truro's vision of 'Learning to love like God!' And as we move forward, we covet your continuing prayers, support, engagement and love in all we do!
