The Poland Pilgrimage

The purpose of the Truro Institute is to teach "skills of accompaniment." When people are away from God or in a state of estrangement and not at peace, we must find ways of connecting and walking with them into an encounter with the Resurrected Christ. But these skills are generally only learned in a community that habitually practices them. Truro and its various missional communities—such as Alpha, Amore, TIPS, Fresh Expressions, and the like—is such a place. We also learn them by apprenticing ourselves to those who have mastered them. The Pilgrimage to Poland is designed for that purpose.

Our Bishop visits every year on Trinity Sunday to lay hands on those being confirmed or received into the Anglican Church in North America (ACNA), as well as those reaffirming their faith. Bp. Our fellowship with Episcopalians is an important part of the pilgrimage. The relationship is best characterized



as a "learning friendship"—not unlike the one we share with Roman Catholics around the ministry of marriage. As friends of each other, and disciples of a common Lord, we enter an "instructional fellowship" in order to learn "the things that make for peace" (Luke 19:42). Czeslaw Milosz, the great Polish poet, describes the process of learning his own "skills of accompaniment." In writing about becoming an adult Christian in the ideological crucible of Nazi fascism, Soviet Communism, and French secularism, Milosz realized "one had to master a skill, like swimming or running, rather than a body of knowledge capable of being set forth in theories. Reality...was a changing, living tissue: it was woven out of countless interdependencies in such a way that even the tiniest detail germinates infinitely; and at the joints that keep its structure mobile, man is able to insert the lever of a conscious act." (*Native Realm: A Search for Self-Definition*).

Four young people will accompany me to Poland this July to study the life of Milosz and his contemporary Pope John Paul II, to learn how the "lever of a conscious act," properly deployed, transformed a world.
