Our plan is to move all existing funds in our current New Campus Fund to the newly-formed Campus Improvement Fund as of July 20, 2017.

As of July 1, 2017, any new contributions to the New Campus Fund will be reallocated to our Campus Improvement Fund. For those who want to contribute to the Campus Improvement Fund, you can now do that, either as a one-time gift or via regular giving.

Although we have done our best to keep the Truro campus in the best possible shape over the last few years, we have delayed large capital expenditures and investing in new infrastructure, and have instead been maintaining and repairing, largely due to the uncertainty of how long we would be here. In the long term, that is unwise, as the cost of maintaining aging equipment and infrastructure can be quickly offset by the savings incurred by investing in new, more durable and effective systems. For example, our 1950s-era boiler to heat the Sanctuary in the winter is extremely old technology, and due to a lack of parts, the cost of repairing that old dinosaur can be pricey. A new system will be much more efficient, much easier to maintain, and much less expensive to operate, saving operational costs from our annual budget in a myriad of ways—and this means more money for ministry!
