## WORSHIP

### Practical Steps Towards Musical Convergence by Jamie Brown

You may have noticed something in our sanctuary: We've built a drum booth! Why?

First, since the drums sit in a corner, and under a curved ceiling, their sound waves ricochet everywhere. This booth allows them to be heard evenly all around the sanctuary.

Second, we're attempting a convergence of musical styles: band, organ, choir, etc. Our choir looks great, but they sound great too. Isolating the drums allows the choir and other instruments to be heard as well.

Third, we want the band, choir, organ, and other instruments to partner and lead worship together. In our sanctuary (designed to reflect sound back at the congregation), this booth allows the singing to ricochet everywhere, while the instruments are mixed together to support it.

Instead of using materials that didn't match the room's aesthetic, we custom-built a booth with fabrics and paint colors that match. Our amazing percussionist, Joe Connell, was involved in its conception and design, and is pleased. Joe is a top-notch musician, who loves Truro, and who is loved by Truro. This booth allows him to "let loose". To those of you who have asked: Joe is very happy.

We've taken other steps in the last couple of years, like removing the floor monitors on stage and opting for in-ear monitors instead, significantly reducing stage volume. This drum booth is a more visible change, but rest assured that its purpose is to encourage even more joy, freedom, and musical convergence in our services in the years to come!
